

Tropar Resurrection, Tone 7: By Your Cross You destroyed death/ To the thief You opened Paradise/ For the Myrrh-bearers You changed weeping into joy/ And You commanded Your disciples, O Christ God/ to proclaim that You are risen/ granting the world great mercy.

Tropar of the Meeting, Tone 1: Rejoice, O Virgin Birth-Giver of God, Full of Grace/ From you shone the Sun of Righteousness, Christ our God/ enlightening those who sat in darkness/ Rejoice and be glad, O Righteous Elder/ You accepted in your arms the Redeemer of our souls/ Who grants us the Resurrection.

Glory... Kondak of the Resurrection, Tone 7: The dominion of death can no longer hold men captive/ for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its powers/ Hell is bound, while the Prophets rejoice and cry:/ The Savior has come to those in faith/ enter, you faithful into the Resurrection.

The Candle Blessing on the Feast of the Meeting of the Lord (Presentation of Christ in the Temple) in Orthodox Christianity is a sacred tradition that symbolizes Christ as the Light of the World and the illumination of humanity by His divine presence.

Meaning of the Candle Blessing: Christ as the Light of the World – The feast commemorates the moment when the righteous Elder Simeon met the infant Jesus Christ in the Temple and recognized Him as the Messiah, calling Him "a light to enlighten the Gentiles" (Luke 2:32). The blessing of candles reflects this theme of Christ bringing divine light into the world.

Spiritual Illumination – Candles are a symbol of faith, hope, and God's presence in the life of believers. When lit, they remind us to seek the spiritual light of Christ, which dispels the darkness of sin.

Protection and Blessing – Blessed candles are often taken home and used throughout the year during prayer, times of distress, or natural calamities, as they are believed to bring God's protection and grace into homes.

Purpose of the Candle Blessing: Liturgical Significance – The blessing occurs as part of the Divine Liturgy or a special service on the feast, reinforcing the connection between Christ's Presentation and the theme of divine light.

Personal and Family Use – we take the blessed candles home and light them during prayers, storms, illnesses, or important events, invoking God's protection and grace.

Communal Tradition – The blessing serves as a reminder to the faithful to carry the light of Christ in their daily lives and to live as "children of the light" (Ephesians 5:8).

This tradition aligns with the overall purpose of the feast: celebrating the revelation of Christ as the Light of the world and encouraging the faithful to welcome Him into their lives with faith and reverence.

Fr. Anthony Coniaris, a well-known Orthodox theologian and writer, often emphasized **the symbolic meaning of candles** in Orthodox Christianity. According to his teachings, candles hold deep spiritual significance, reflecting several key aspects of faith and worship. Some of the main symbolic meanings include:

- 1. Christ as the Light of the World. Candles symbolize Jesus Christ, who is the "Light of the World" (John 8:12). Just as a candle dispels darkness, Christ dispels the darkness of sin and ignorance.
- 2. The Presence of the Holy Spirit. The flame represents the Holy Spirit, as seen in the form of tongues of fire at Pentecost (Acts 2:3). Lighting a candle is a way of invoking God's presence in prayer.
- 3. The Faithful as the Light of the World. Christ calls His followers to be the light of the world (Matthew 5:14-16).

The candle reminds believers to live in righteousness, shining with God's love and truth.

- 4. Sacrificial Love and Self-Giving. A candle gives light by burning itself, symbolizing self-sacrifice and love. Just as the candle melts away, Christians are called to give of themselves in service to God and others.
- 5. Prayer and the Ascension of the Soul. The rising flame symbolizes prayer ascending to God, just as incense rises in worship. It represents the believer's desire to be lifted up toward God in holiness.
- 6. Spiritual Purification. Fire is often associated with purification and divine presence (e.g., the Burning Bush in Exodus 3:2). The candle flame reminds the faithful of the refining power of God's grace.
- 7. Victory Over Darkness and Evil. The light of a candle is a symbol of victory over darkness, sin, and death. This is especially evident in Pascha (Easter), when the Resurrection is proclaimed with lighted candles.

In summary, according to Fr. Anthony Coniaris, candles in Orthodox worship are not just decorative but deeply theological symbols, reflecting Christ's light, prayer, sacrifice, and spiritual purification. Lighting a candle is an act of faith and devotion, reminding believers of their calling to live as bearers of divine light in the world.

We recommend to read the book "Sacred Symbols that Speak" by Fr. Antony Coniaris to learn more about the major symbols of the Orthodox Church.

Євангеліє дня: 22 І коли настали дні очищення за законом Мойсеєвим, то принесли Його до Єрусалима, щоб поставити перед Господом, 23 як написано в законі Господньому, щоб усяка дитина чоловічої статі, яка розкриває утробу, була посвячена Господеві. 24 І щоб принести в жертву, як сказано в законі Господньому, дві горлиці або двоє голуб'ят. 25 Був тоді в Єрусалимі чоловік на ім'я Симеон. Він був муж праведний та благочестивий, що чекав утіхи Ізраїлевої, і Дух Святий був на ньому. 26 Йому було провіщено Духом Святим, що він не побачить смерти, доки не побачить Христа Господнього. 27 І був він приведений Духом у храм. І коли батьки принесли Немовля Ісуса, щоб зробити з Ним за законним звичаєм, 28 він взяв Його на руки, благословив Бога і сказав: 29 нині відпускаєш раба Твого, Владико, за словом Твоїм, з миром, 30 бо бачили очі мої спасіння Твоє, 31 яке Ти приготував перед лицем усіх народів, 32 світло на просвітлення язичників і славу народу Твого Ізраїля.
