

PROPERS FOR THE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

Tropar of the Resurrection, Tone 3: Let the heavens rejoice/ Let the earth be glad/ For the Lord has shown strength with His Arm/ He has trampled down death by death/ He has become the first born of the dead/ He has delivered us from the depths of Hell. And has granted to the world/ great mercy.

Tropar of the Dormition of the Virgin Mary, Tone 1: In giving birth, you preserved your virginity/ In falling asleep, you did not forsake the world, Birth-Giver of God/ You were translated to life, Mother of Life/ and through your prayers you deliver our souls from death.

Tropar to the Holy Apostles, Tone 3: Holy Apostles, Erastus, Olympas, Herodion, Sosipater, Quartus and Tertius/ entreat the merciful God/ to grant our souls forgiveness of transgressions.

Kondak of the Resurrection, Tone 3: On this day You rose from the tomb, O Merciful One/ leading us from the gates of death/ On this day Adam exults as Eve rejoices/ with the Prophets and Patriarchs/ they unceasingly praise the divine majesty of Your power.

Glory... Kondak to the Apostles, Tone 2: Illumined by divine light, O holy Apostles/ you wisely destroyed the works of idolatry/ When you caught all the pagans you brought them to the Master/ and taught them to glorify the Trinity.

Now and ever... Kondak of the Dormition, Tone 2: Neither the tomb nor death had power over the Birth-Giver of God/ she is ever watchful in her prayers and in her intercession lies unfailing hope/ for as the Mother of Life/ she has been translated to Life by the One/ Who dwelt within her ever-virginal womb.

Prokimen of the Resurrection, Tone 3: Sing praises to our God, sing praises. Sing praises to our King, sing praises.

Verse: Clap your hands all peoples. Shout to God with loud songs of joy.


Epistle: Galatians 1: 1-19

I never cut my neighbor's throat My neighbor's gold I never stole; never spoiled his house or land; But God have mercy on my sou! For I am haunted night and day

By all the deeds I have not done...

What can we learn and practice from today's Scripture readings?

1. The Orthodox Church teaches that love for God and love for neighbor are inseparable. The first commandment is to love God with every part of one's being, and the second, which is just like it, is to love one's neighbor as oneself. The neighbor in this context is not limited to those who are easy to love (family, friends, fellow believers), but extends to everyone, especially those in need. This commandment is a way of life that forms the core of Christian ethics and the pathway to salvation.

2. Christ as the Ultimate Neighbor. The Orthodox view emphasizes that Christ Himself is the ultimate example of love for neighbor. The parable illustrates how God came to us in the person of Christ, not as a distant or remote figure, but as one who enters into our suffering and need. Christ is the Good Samaritan who comes to heal and restore humanity, wounded by sin, through His incarnation, crucifixion, and resurrection. His sacrificial love is the model for Christian life.

The parable teaches that true love for neighbor requires self-sacrifice, going beyond the bare minimum to care for those in need, even when it involves personal cost.

3. Mercy Over Legalism. In the parable, the priest and the Levite pass by the wounded man without offering help, despite their knowledge of the law and religious status. The Samaritan, however, a person considered an outsider and even an enemy to the Jews, is the one who shows mercy and compassion. This contrast highlights a recurring theme in the Gospels: that outward religious observance is insufficient without the inner transformation that leads to compassion and mercy. In Orthodox spirituality, there is a strong emphasis on mercy, humility, and charity over legalistic or ritualistic observance. The Orthodox Church teaches that to love God is to love one's neighbor, and this love is often expressed through acts of mercy and kindness. True piety is shown in how we treat others, particularly those who are suffering.

4. Radical Inclusion. The Samaritan, a member of a group despised by Jews, becomes the hero of the parable. This radical inclusion is a key aspect of the Orthodox understanding of the Gospel: the Kingdom of God is open to all, regardless of nationality, social status, or ethnicity. In the modern context, this can be seen as an invitation to embrace people who are marginalized, oppressed, or otherwise viewed as "other" by society.

5. Christ's Healing Ministry. In the Orthodox Christian tradition, the healing of the wounded man represents Christ's work of healing humanity. The Samaritan not only gives immediate help (bandaging the wounds) but also makes provisions for ongoing care. This action can be interpreted as a metaphor for Christ's redemptive work in the world: He heals the brokenness of humanity, not just momentarily but with a view to eternal healing and restoration.

6. Call to Action: Faith without Works is Dead. When Jesus concludes the parable by asking, "Which of these three do you think was neighbor to him who fell among the thieves?" the lawyer answers, "He who showed mercy on him." Jesus then commands, "Go and do likewise." This command underscores the Orthodox understanding of the Christian life as one of action. Faith is not merely intellectual assent but must be lived out in tangible acts of love, mercy, and service. In Orthodox Christianity, salvation is understood as a process of transformation that requires both faith and works. The parable challenges believers to act in love and mercy, to embody the Gospel in concrete ways in their everyday lives.

7. The Importance of Compassion. The Orthodox tradition teaches that our hearts must be softened and open to the suffering of others, and this requires a continual process of repentance and humility. Compassion leads to the imitation of Christ, who had "compassion on the multitudes" and healed them. Conclusion. Luke 10:25-37 teaches profound spiritual truths about the nature of God's love, the importance of mercy, the necessity of loving one's neighbor (including those whom society may deem "other"), and the radical inclusivity of the Gospel. The parable invites Christians to reflect on their own

lives and how they can more fully embody the love of Christ by offering mercy, healing, and care to those in need. In sum, the Good Samaritan is not just a model for individual behavior but a revelation of the nature of God's Kingdom, which is one of mercy, compassion, and healing for all people.

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ORTHODOX WORLD NEWS

More than 100 Orthodox monastics (monks & nuns) from 9 countries gathered for their international assembly at the 11th C. Monastery of St. Prohor in Serbia.

Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew I paid an extended visit in October to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Australian Archdiocese which has 8 bishops, a college and theological seminary and more than 500,000 followers.

Patriarch Daniel of Bulgaria officiated at the Feast of the Glorification of the Relics of St. Euthymius at the Bachkovo Monastery.

Patriarch Porfirije of Serbia consecrated the large Church of St. Demetrios in Dalj, Croatia which had been closed by the Nazis during World War II.


Eight people were baptized and chrismated into the Orthodox Faith at St. Michael's Church in Hot Springs, Arkansas by Priest Tomislav Savic.
