PROPERS FOR THE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

Tropar of the Resurrection, Tone 2: When You descended to death, Life Immortal, You slayed Hell with the splendor of Your Divinity. And when from the depths, You raised the dead, all the Powers of Heaven cried out: Giver of Life, Christ our God, glory to You.

Tropar of the Dormition of the Mother of God, Tone 1: In giving birth, you preserved your virginity. In falling asleep you did not forsake the world, Birth-Giver of God. You were translated to life, Mother of Life, and through your prayers you deliver our souls from death.

Tropar to Great Martyr James Tone 4: You astounded all, long-suffering James, by enduring horrible tortures with great patience. As the evil assembly performed the slaughter, you uttered prayers of thanksgiving to the Lord. Through your sufferings you received your crown, and came to the throne of the heavenly King, Christ God. Entreat Him to save our souls.

Glory... Kondak to James the Persian, Tone 2: You listened to your faithful wife and contemplated the judgment of God, holy James; you despised the threats and commands of the Persians, accepting the cutting of your body as though you were a vine. Therefore, you were revealed as a martyr worthy of honor.

Now and ever... Kondak of the Dormition, Tone 2: Neither the tomb nor death had power over the Birth-Giver of God, she is ever watchful in her prayers, and in her intercession lies unfailing hope, for as the Mother of Life, she has been translated to Life, by the One Who dwelt within her ever-virginal womb.

Prokimen of the Resurrection, Tone 2: The Lord is my strength and my song. He has become my salvation.

Verse: The Lord has chastened me sorely, but He has not given me over to death.





Jesus Heals on the Sabbath. The Gospel lesson today recalls Jesus healing a woman who suffered from an infirmity for a lengthy time. At the word of command the woman is healed, and stands erect for the first time in eighteen years. Yet, this marvelous work of Jesus was the object not of praise and wonder but of criticism and indignation. The chief of the synagogue declared to the congregation that Jesus had broken Jewish law by healing the woman on the Sabbath, which was understood to be a day of rest in the most literal sense.

Jesus countered this accusation by explaining that if, out of necessity, a straying oxen would be sought out on the Sabbath or beasts given food and drink, then how much more righteous was it to restore to health a child of Abraham. Hearing this, the opponents of Jesus were filled with confusion and His followers rejoiced.

We, too, as followers of Jesus, can rejoice with His disciples at the marvelous deed performed on this occasion. We can see the hypocrisy of the synagogue chiefs attitude. Yet, we can also be guilty of the same type of hypocrisy and self-righteousness when we find ourselves lacking in the humility to admit when we are wrong, or that the viewpoint of another might have more merit than our own. May this Gospel lesson enlighten our minds and hearts to always be open to true humility, which both admits mistakes and acknowledges the good in others.

Ephesians 6:12 is a verse that describes the spiritual warfare that Christians face in their lives. This verse means that the real enemies of the Christian are not other human beings, but the demonic forces that influence them and the world. These forces are organized in a hierarchy of evil, from the lower-level demons to the higher-level principalities and powers. They operate in the realm of the air, which is the space between the earth and the heaven, where Satan and his angels were cast out after their rebellion against God (Rev 12:7-9). The orthodox christian tradition teaches that the Christian must be vigilant and prepared to resist these evil forces, by putting on the full armor of God, as described in the following verses of Ephesians 6:13-17.

This armor consists of the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the shoes of the gospel of peace, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Each of these elements represents a spiritual virtue or weapon that the Christian must cultivate and use in the battle against the enemy. Also crucial is prayer as a way of communicating with God and receiving His strength and guidance in the spiritual warfare. Ephesians 6:18 says: And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of

prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people.

Proskomedia. Before every Divine Liturgy, the priest prepares gifts of bread and wine to be used during the Eucharist. The preparation ritual is called the Liturgy of Preparation, or proskomedia. The meaning in Greek is "offering", indicating that it is our offering to God. God has blessed us with wheat and grapes, and we transform it into bread and wine, offering it back to God in thanksgiving. God then consecrates the bread and wine during the Divine Liturgy, returning it to us transformed.

The bread that is offered in the Eucharist is called prosphora, a special loaf whose preparation itself is filled with meaning. It is created using only wheat, yeast, water, and salt and is composed of two layers, representing the two natures of Christ, divine and human. It has a square seal on the top with the Greek letters IC XC (an abbreviation in Greek for Jesus Christ) and NIKA (meaning "conquers").

During the proskomedia, a portion of the loaf is cut out into a cube, and it is this inner part of the loaf, called the lamb, that is consecrated during the Divine Liturgy, and together with the red wine, will become the Body and Blood of Christ.

The Liturgy of Preparation includes blessing the prosphoron, cutting it on four sides to form a cube, piercing it with a spear, and reciting two verses from St. John's Gospel (John 19:34-35). The wine is mixed with water in a chalice and blessed by the priest. The priest then cuts triangular particles from a second prosphoron in commemoration of the Theotokos, from a third prosphoron to commemorate the ranks of saints, from a fourth prosphoron for the living, and from a fifth prosphoron for the departed. Finally, the censer is blessed, the cover for the gifts is blessed, and then the gifts are covered. (essentialbeliefs.org)
