

## PROPERS FOR THE LITURGY OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM

**Tropar of the Resurrection, Tone 1:** When the stone had been sealed by the Jews/ while the soldiers were guarding You Most Pure Body/ You arose on the third day, Savior/ granting life to the world/ The powers of Heaven therefore cried to You, O Giver of Life/ "Glory to Your Resurrection, O Christ/ Glory to Your Kingdom/ Glory to Your dispensation, O Lover of Mankind."

**Tropar of the Holy Fathers, Tone 2:** Great are the accomplishments of faith/ for the three Holy Youths rejoice in the fountain of flames, as though in the waters of rest/ and the Prophet Daniel appeared/ a shepherd to the lions as though they were sheep/ So by their prayers, O Christ God, save our souls.

**Tropar of the PreFeast, Tone 4:** Prepare, O Bethlehem, for Eden has been opened to all/ Adorn yourself, O Ephratha, for the Tree of Life blossoms forth from the Virgin in the cave/ Her womb is a spiritual paradise planted with the Divine Fruit/ if we eat of it, we shall live forever, and not die like Adam/ Christ is born to raise up again what fell in former times, His image.

**Glory... Kondak of the Holy Fathers, Tone 1**: Rejoice, O Bethlehem! Prepare yourself, O Ephratha/ The Lamb is on her way to give birth to the Chief Shepherd she carries in her womb/ The God-bearing Fore-fathers will rejoice, beholding Him/ and with the shepherds, they will glorify the Virgin nursing Him.

**Now and ever...Kondak PreFeast, T. 3:** Today the Virgin comes to the cave/ to give birth to the Eternal Word/ Hear the glad tidings and rejoice, O universe/ Glorify with the angels and the shepherds/ the Eternal God, Who is willing to appear as a little child.

**Prokimen** of the Three Children, Tone 4: Blessed are You, Lord God of our Fathers, praised and glorified is Your Name to the ages.

V: For You are righteous in all that You have accomplished for us.

There are many Old Testament prophecies about Jesus Christ. Some interpreters place the number of Messianic prophecies in the hundreds. The following are those that are considered the clearest and most important. Regarding Jesus' birth—Isaiah 7:14: "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel." 9 Isaiah 9:6: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Micah 5:2: "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times." Concerning Jesus' ministry and death—Zechariah 9:9: "Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a



donkey." Psalm 22:16-18: "Dogs have surrounded me; a band of evil men has encircled me, they have pierced my hands and my feet. I can count all my bones; people stare and gloat over me. They divide my garments among them and cast lots for my clothing." Likely the clearest prophecy about Jesus is the entire 53rd chapter of Isaiah. Isaiah 53:3-7 is especially unmistakable: "He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth." The "seventy sevens" prophecy in Daniel chapter 9 predicted the precise date that Jesus, the Messiah, would be "cut off." Isaiah 50:6 accurately describes the beating that Jesus endured. Zechariah 12:10 predicts the "piercing" of the Messiah, which occurred after Jesus died on the cross. Many more examples could be provided, but these will suffice. The Old Testament most definitely prophesies the coming of Jesus as the Messiah.

### **ORTHODOX WORLD NEWS**



At the Kyiv Orthodox Theological Academy, Metropolitan Epiphaniy, attended a St. Nicholas Event for children, presenting them with gifts.

Metropolitan Avhustyn of Bila Tserkva, Head of the Cooperation with Armed Forces congratulated military forces of Ukraine on the Day of the Armed Forces. Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew consecrated the former Roman Catholic Church of Santa Maria(17th C.) given to the Orthodox community of Smyrna, Turkey, renamed the Orthodox Cathedral of the Dormition of the Virgin Mary.





The Feast of St. Catherine was celebrated at the Patriarchal Monastery on Mt. Sinai, built by Emperor Justinian in 565 and led by Archbishop Damianos.

#### Additions in Ukrainian

**Євангеліє дня:** 18 Різдво Ісуса Христа було так: по зарученні Матері Його Марії з Йосифом, перш ніж зійтися їм, виявилося, що Вона має в утробі від Духа Святого. 19 Йосиф же, чоловік Її, будучи праведним і не бажаючи ославити Її, хотів потай відпустити Її. 20 Та щойно він помислив це, як ось ангел Господній з'явився йому уві сні, промовляючи: Йосифе, сину Давидів! Не бійся прийняти Марію, жону твою, бо зачате в Ній є від Духа Святого. 21 Народить же Вона Сина, і наречеш Йому ім'я Ісус, бо Він спасе людей Своїх від гріхів їхніх. 22 Це ж усе сталося, щоб збулося сказане Господом через пророка, який говорить: 23 ось Діва в утробі прийме й народить Сина, і наречуть ім'я Йому Еммануїл, що означає: з нами Бог. 24 Прокинувшись, Йосиф зробив, як звелів йому ангел Господній, і прийняв жону свою. 25 І не знав Її, поки й породила Сина Свого первістка, і він нарік ім'я Йому: Ісус.
